SCNSW/ACT Route Setter Selection Criteria for State Events

This document has been developed to create a standardized selection process for state level events to ensure setters across NSW and ACT get access to setting opportunities.

Head setter being respectful of gym and gym being respectful of head setter

Setting expenses for state level events are the responsibility of the hosting facility or to be negotiated with Sport Climbing NSW/ACT.

On average total setting hours can vary from 250-300 hours for a full juniors and seniors state level event.

Setting teams for state level events should have no more than six setters including the Head Setter.

Eligibility:

Setters looking to set at a state level event must meet one of the following eligibility criterias:

- Minimum 3 years consistent commercial setting experience
- Set a state level event in the last 3 years
- Has a reference letter from a current State Head Setter.

Facility nominated setters:

Hosting facilities may select two setters from their regular team to be part of the setting for the event given they meet the above eligibility. If the facility also has an accredited head setter this can serve as an additional space giving the facility a total of 3 spaces for setters. If the facility doesn't have any setters that fulfill the above criteria they forfeit their setter selection and all selections will be made by the head setter in line with the above eligibility.

Developmental setter selection:

One spot must be allocated from either the facility or head setters selection to a setter that has not had the opportunity to set a state level event before. In which case this setter must still meet one of the other eligibility criteria.

Additional setter selection:

The head setter will select the remaining setters for the event based off the following criteria:

- Diversity of the setting team
- Demonstrated motivation as a competition setter.
- Past experience as a competitor.

Application process

An open registration form will be available on the Sport Climbing NSW/ACT website where setters will be able to apply for competitions throughout the year. Applications must be submitted no later than 6 weeks prior to the event.

Head Setter

Will be selected by the SCNSW/ACT Board and Route Setting board.

Pathway to Head Setter

- 1. Meet competition setter eligibility
- 2. Set 2 state level events
- 3. Been assessed as a head setter under the guidance of an existing head setter.
- 4. Qualified Head Setter

Assessing Head Setters must have head set a minimum of 3 State or National Level Events.
